#### January Flu Catch up Clinics

# The DfE have updated the guidelines, following the increasing infection rates.

Children aged 5 years and over, and all adults must take lateral flow tests for 7 days if they are a close contact of someone with Covid-19 (of any variety). Children's negative test results should be reported to school daily by email to office.3085@launton.oxon.sch.uk if the child is non-symptomatic and attending school.

If they test positive, they should self-isolate and <u>order a PCR test</u> to confirm the result. If the PCR is positive, they must self-isolate for 10 days. If the PCR test is negative, they no longer need to self-isolate but should continue to carry out the remainder of the daily tests, and only need to isolate if it is positive.

For primary aged children <u>LFD test kits are available through the usual</u> <u>routes</u> (community test sites, local pharmacies or online).

Children under five years old do not need to take part in daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 and do not need to isolate.

Anyone over the age of 18 years and 6 months who is not vaccinated, must isolate in line with government guidelines if they are a close contact of a positive case.

#### **Reading Challenge**

We'd also like to share with you details of The Reading Agency's Winter Mini Challenge, a follow-up to their Summer Reading Challenge, which many of your children will have enjoyed.
